
Norbert Zimmermann

Nomadic is a former tender of the White Star Line, used for transferring passengers and mail to and from R.M.S. Olympic and R.M.S. Titanic. Built by Harland & Wolff, she was launched from their Belfast yard on the 25th of April, 1911. She is the only White Star Line vessel in existence today.

Titanic Walking Trail

A guided walking tour that will take in the last surviving White Star Line vessel, S.S. *Nomadic*; the former Harland & Wolff offices, now Titanic Hotel Belfast; the Harland & Wolff shipyard slipways, where the Olympic-Class liners were constructed; 'The Great Light', one of the world's rarest lighthouse optics; last survivor from the WWI Battle of Jutland, H.M.S. *Caroline*; and the Thompson Dry Dock, where *Titanic* and *Olympic* were completed.

The walk will start at the Titanic Hotel Belfast. NOTE: Tour does not include boarding *Nomadic*, or H.M.S. *Caroline*. Boarding *Nomadic* will be included in your Titanic Attraction ticket.

City Bus & Cemetery Tour

A bus tour to Belfast City Cemetery, the final resting place of many notable figures, including Harland & Wolff's co-founder, Edward Harland, and chairman Sir William Pirrie. Fifteen-year-old Samuel Scott is also buried here; the first person to be killed, when he slipped from a ladder during the construction of *Titanic*. En-route to the cemetery, the tour will take in iconic Belfast sights such as the world-famous Peace Wall and Murals.

The bus will start and finish the tour at the Titanic Hotel Belfast.

River Lagan Boat Trip

This river tour on the "Lady of the Lagan" will take you through the past and present of Belfast shipbuilding. Some of the biggest and most productive shipbuilders in the world, lined the banks of the River Lagan for almost 200 years. Enjoy sights such as the Harland & Wolff slipways, the Thompson dry dock gate, Thompson Wharf, the Seal Sanctuary, and the unmissable Harland & Wolff cranes 'Samson & Goliath'.

This tour will start and finish at the Thompson Dock Pumphouse. It is possible that we can arrange transport there and back for those with mobility issues.
